reached number 26 on the UK Singles Chart, and "What's Your Problem", which did not chart. "What's Your Problem" did not enter the UK Singles Chart, but peaked - English rock band the Zutons have released four studio albums and 14 singles, nine of which entered the top 40 of the UK Singles Chart.

The band released their debut album, Who Killed..... The Zutons?, in April 2004 to critical acclaim and it sold well, reaching number 6 on the UK Albums Chart with platinum status. Five singles were released from the album: "Pressure Point", "You Will You Won't", "Remember Me", "Don't Ever Think (Too Much)" and "Confusion", all released in 2004 and reaching numbers 19, 22, 39, 15 and 37 on the UK Singles Chart respectively.

In 2006, the Zutons released their second album, Tired of Hanging Around. It sold well and reached number 2 on the UK Albums Chart, going platinum. From this album, they released four singles: "Why Won't You Give Me Your Love?", "Valerie", "Oh Stacey (Look What You've Done!)" and "It's the Little Things We Do" all in 2006 reaching numbers 9, 9, 24 and 47 on the UK Singles Chart respectively.

In June 2008, the band released their third studio album, *You Can Do Anything*, which peaked at number 6 on the UK Albums Chart. They released two singles from the album: "Always Right Behind You", which reached number 26 on the UK Singles Chart, and "What's Your Problem", which did not chart.

The band was originally named Skull but changed its name to Teddybears Sthlm shortly before Klas Åhlund joined the group. In 2006, the band dropped "Sthlm" from its name and became simply Teddybears.

The episodes "Now We're Only Falling Apart", "What's Your Problem?", "The Question", "Made of Honor" - Steven Universe is an American animated television series created by Rebecca Sugar for Cartoon Network. The series revolves around Steven Universe (voiced by Zach Callison), who protects his hometown of Beach City alongside Garnet (voiced by Estelle), Amethyst (voiced by Michaela Dietz) and Pearl (voiced by Deedee Magno Hall), three magical alien guardians known as the Crystal Gems. During the original run of the series, episodes of Steven Universe were variously broadcast once a week; in blocks of multiple new episodes in the course of a week, marketed as "Stevenbombs"; or back-to-back as specials with an umbrella title.

During the course of the series, 160 episodes of Steven Universe aired over five seasons, between November 4, 2013, and January 21, 2019. A television film, *Steven Universe: The Movie*, was released on September 2, 2019, following the fifth and final season. A concluding limited series, *Steven Universe Future*, premiered on December 7, 2019, and ended on March 27, 2020.
